Effects of Covid-19 Pandemic on the Welfare of the Maasai Girl Child in Narok County, Kenya

Abstract

The Maasai girl child is vulnerable to poor menstrual hygiene, teen pregnancies, early man domestic violence and female genital mutilation (FGM). Schools had temporarily offered to shelter towards these challenges. However, the covid-19 pandemic led to the indefinite clo schools forcing the girls back home to the full glare of these predicaments. Additionally, the fear of the health pandemic which had also affected the economy. This study aimed at exa how the covid-19 pandemic had affected the welfare of the Maasai girl child in Narok of Kenya. A cross-sectional design of the study was used. Data was collected using questionnain observations. Descriptive analysis was used to analyze the data. The findings indicat frustrations over lack of basic needs coupled with numerous domestic violence incidences the girls to engage in 'sex for sanitary towels'. 83.1% of the girls did not use any sex pro means while a majority of the rest used ineffective methods. FGM was at its peak as the abundant time to practice it and less government interference. In conclusion, the Maasa welfare was in dire need of external assistance. Government and non-governmental organi (NGOs) should urgently intervene to rescue the Maasai girl child.
