- 4. a) Discuss the possible main problem in the story *Jambula Tree* by Monica Arc de Nyeko, as read for this class, and how it is resolved. (5 mks)
 - b) Assuming that you have decided to turn the short story into a play, write a one page dialogue that captures the main character in dialogue form at some point in the resolution. (15 mks)
- 5. a) Provide a critique of the use of stage descriptions in the play *I Just Got Back* by ParsaleloKantai (10 mks)
 - b) Write a one page monologue that reimagines the main problem of the main character in the play. (10 mks)
